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### **SUMMER PEAK; SAME GREAT PROGRAM, NEW PARTNER**

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. (April 3, 2006) This summer, Mount Pleasant's Partners Empowering All Kids (PEAK) program is teaming-up with Central Michigan University's Summer Reading Clinic.

The 2006 Summer PEAK Program will run for six weeks, June 26 through August 4, including six new and exciting themes. Students may also enroll in the CMU Summer Reading Clinic running July 5 through August 3. Two PEAK sites will host CMU's Summer Reading program for two hours, Monday through Thursday.

"Many students attend PEAK during the summer. We recognize transportation and time limitations for both students and parents may be an issue. This partnership will better accommodate busy summer schedules while meeting student's literacy needs," said Dr. Lee Rose, CMU Summer Reading Clinic Director.

The CMU Summer Reading Clinic is available to all students in grades kindergarten through six. Students needing extra help or looking for reading advancement may register; however, students with teacher referrals will have priority enrollment.

"We're happy to expand opportunities for our youth. PEAK and CMU's Summer Reading Program share the same goal – to make learning fun," said Nate Lockwood, PEAK Director.
