Open to 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students residing in Isabella County

Priority enrollment will be given to Mt. Pleasant School District students because of retention.

### Registration

The registration deadline is Wednesday, June 17, 2009. The enrollment fee is \$100.00 per student or \$200.00 for out of district students. Scholarship funding is available. ### Scholarship Funding Available

The goal of the PEAK Summer School Program is for all students to attend the summer educational program regardless of personal financial situations. If your student would not be able to attend due to the cost of the program, scholarships are available to allow your student to participate. To request a scholarship, simply check the box on the attached registration form and someone will contact you.

### Transportation

Transportation is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Please do not bring your student to M.P.H.S. before 7:45 am, as proper adult supervision is not available until then. Please pick up your student up by 12:30 pm each day.

ICTC passes are available to students who qualify. If interested, please contact Tyler Foraker at 989-944-3922.

### Attendance Requirements

Students may NOT be absent more than two days during the six weeks of summer school. Students absent three days are immediately suspended from the program and fail their class(es) regardless of grades earned up to that time. For each two classroom tardies your student receives, it will be equal to one absence. PLEASE BE ON TIME!

### Discipline Procedures

Disrespectful and inappropriate behavior will NOT be tolerated. Student(s) removed from a class by a teacher will immediately be suspended from the summer school program without a refund and will fail the class(es) regardless of grade(s) earned up to that point.

### Class Cancellations

PEAK reserves the right to cancel any class if enrollment is not sufficient to warrant offering that class (less than 10 students).

### Nutrition Break

One snack is provided each day at 10:00 am during a 15-minute snack break. Students may also bring their own snacks or use the vending machines at the school during this time (only beverage is available).

## Summer School 2009 Policy

(Sponsored by the P.E.A.K. Program)

- \* Students may sign up for classes that they did not fail during the school year ONLY AFTER seats are filled with those students who failed classes during the school year.
- \* Students may not receive credit in classes that they did not fail during the school year.
- \* A student may not “accumulate” classes. Example: If a student fails zero (0) or one (1) class during the regular school year and passes one (1) or two (2) Summer School classes, that student does not have a “+” credit status going into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

### 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Students-- 2008-2009

NOTE: Students who fail three (3) or less semester classes are **promoted** to the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.  
Students who fail four (4) or more semester classes are **retained** in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

1. Priority enrollment will be given to a 7<sup>th</sup> grade student who failed four (4) or five (5) semester classes.
  - a. A student who failed four (4) semester classes **must pass** one (1) Summer school class (D- or better) in the same subject area as the one (1) of the four (4) semester classes he/she failed during the school year for placement (NOT PROMOTION) into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
  - b. A student who failed five (5) semester classes **must pass** two (2) Summer School classes (D- or better) in the same subject areas as two (2) of the five (5) semester classes he/she failed during the school year for placement (NOT PROMOTION) into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
2. A student who failed six (6) or more semester classes will be retained in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade for the next school year even if the student does choose to attend Summer School classes and passes them.  
**If and appeal meeting is schedule by the parent/guardian, a decision may be reached at that appeal meeting for placement into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.**

### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Students—2008-2009

NOTE: Students who fail four (4) or less semester classes in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade combined are **promoted** to the 9<sup>th</sup> grade  
Students who fail five (5) or more semester classes in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade combined are **retained** in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

1. Priority enrollment will be given to 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who failed five (5) or six (6) semester classes.
  - a. A student who failed five (5) semester classes **must pass** one (1) Summer School class (D- or better) in the same subject area as one (1) of the five (5) semester classes he/she failed during the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade combined in order for placement (NOT PROMOTION) in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
  - b. A student who failed six (6) semester classes **must pass** two (2) Summer School classes (D- or better) in the same subject areas as two (2) of the six (6) semester classes he/she failed during the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade combined in order for placement (NOT PROMOTION) into the 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
2. A student who failed seven (7) or more semester classes in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade combined AND DID NOT PASS SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES IN THE 7<sup>th</sup> GRADE will be retained in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade for the next school year even if the student chooses to attend Summer School classes and passes them. **If and appeal meeting is scheduled by the parent/guardian, a decision may be reached at the appeal meeting for placement into the 9<sup>th</sup> grade.**

## Student Behavior Contract - Summer School 2009

**A student may NOT miss more than two (2) days throughout the six-weeks of Summer School**

I understand that upon missing a 3<sup>rd</sup> day of Summer School, I will be suspended from Summer School.

### **2 Tardies = 1 Absence**

I understand that 2 tardies equals 1 absence, and that I am expected to be on time for all my classes. Classes begin exactly at 8:00 am and again at exactly 10:15 am. Students arriving after that time are considered tardy.

### **Disrespectful, inappropriate and unsafe behavior will NOT be tolerated.**

I understand that if my actions become disrespectful, inappropriate or unsafe at any time during Summer School, or while on school property, I will be suspended from Summer School.

I also understand that if I am asked by a teacher to leave class for disrespectful or inappropriate behavior I will be suspended from Summer School.

### **Consequences of Suspension: NO REFUND and NO GRADES**

I understand that if I am suspended from Summer School, it is without a financial refund, and I automatically fail all classes regardless of grades earned up to that time.
